fantastic hosts, even making sure that
there's homemade wheaten bread, jam
and shortbread in you apartment.

The apartments are set in the courtyard of a working farm, so this place is just perfect for kids. Parents

can relax at the tables in the courtyard with a beverage and the paper, while the kids race around with the local kids and play with the dogs, peacocks, goats and cats. If you have your own pet, they too are welcome, and the Lowries have welcomed everything from a hamster to a horse.

Jump on your bike and within seconds you are on the Blessingbourne mountain bike trails (see p22). You can also go walking, fishing and horse riding. Be sure to have a peek into the Carriage and Costume Museum at the collection of carriages and coaches, buggies, penny farthings, a genuine Romany caravan and old farm machinery.

At night-time, it's only a short walk down to the family-owned Valley Hotel, which has smashing mountain-biker-sized portions of food. If you are still up for it, you can boogie on down until the wee small hours in the massive nightclub.
